He spent about one year as a visiting professor at the LABISE (CNPq fellow, 1999–2000) being involved in the study of Ediacaran granitoids (Alto Pajeú Terrane) and collaborating in guidance of graduate students. His scientific interest encompasses the origin of granitoids, from source to emplacement in the crust, particularly on the physical processes involved, and on magma-tectonics interaction, besides structural control of gold mineralizations. He is currently working on southern Brazil, Pampean Ranges, Himalayas, and on the Variscan of Central Europe, China and on different terrains of Australia. He holds a full professor position at the School of Geosciences, Monash University, Melbourne, Australia.
